Through it all, our purpose has remained simple: **Transforming** writing for life.



Success in schools

Improving results year on year

Al Sadiq College is a K-12 Muslim Alawite school in Sydney where all students come from a non-English speaking background.

'In 2018, less than 25% of students in Years 3-6 were able to compose a 'satisfactory' piece of writing. My team and I felt it was key to not just improve student writing, but also impart a love for it. So we brought in the Seven Steps – and have seen a consistent and marked improvement in NAPLAN ever since.

Our 2022 results in writing have been the best yet! More than 50% of students in both Years 3 and 5 are sitting in the top two bands. And for the first time, many of our Year 7 students have hit the top band.

Seven Steps has allowed our students to write in sequential steps, build their vocabulary and extend their creativity.

The most surprising achievement was one of our Year 2 students submitting a creative piece of writing in the NESA Write On competition and winning a Stage 1 silver award.

Turning writing into a strength

For Bunbury Primary School in WA, writing was the area of the curriculum that needed improvement.

Our approach

What makes the Seven Steps approach so successful?

It's a simple shift in thinking.

Think about learning a sport. When you show up for your first tennis lesson, you're shown a particular technique – let's say the forehand – and you practise it over and over. Before you know it, you've built up a bit of skill and the technique goes into muscle memory – it doesn't feel so difficult.

It's the same with writing. Students need to learn and practise the skills in isolation first. Asking students to 'write a story' is like asking the new tennis student to play an entire tennis match. It's just too big and you are setting them up to fail!

If you want to learn how to write, ask a writer!

Developed by international author and former teacher Jen McVeity, Seven Steps explicitly teaches students the skills that professional authors use.

These are the skills that students need to:

- plan and structure an engaging text
- come up with unique and cohesive ideas
- hook the reader from the first sentence
- bring writing to life with descriptive language.

No gimmicks with Seven Steps, just powerful pedagogy and strategies.

What are the Seven Steps?



The building blocks for great writing

Seven Steps breaks down writing into manageable chunks, so students aren't overwhelmed by writing a whole piece straight away. Instead, students gain confidence with each Step they learn, practising each technique in isolation using fun, collaborative activities.

After practising the individual techniques, they then learn how to put them all together to write complete texts, becoming independent, creative and engaging writers.








Improving student writing in just 10 weeks!

Teachers across Australia tested their students before and after 10 weeks of implementation of the Seven Steps, then shared the data with us for analysis. Here are the results* from 1,740 Foundation to Year 9 students.



NAPLAN marking criteria that saw the greatest improvement:



In just 10 weeks, the majority of students taught the Seven Steps improved by the equivalent of 2 years in writing ability.
